Day Date Month Ye a Weds 14th April	ar 2021 Annual	Over £80 million has been expended locally in the last 12 months to help the most vulnerable with hardship and isolation payments, council tax support and other help for the homeless and destitute, together with targeted grants to businesses to protect livelihoods and save jobs. That's in addition to the national Governments furlough schemes, business rate rebates and increase in Universal Credit.
Weds 12th May Weds 16th June	Parish 2021 Meeting 2021	It isn't just the work South Norfolk has done with central Government that's made a difference. Our Help Hub staff have extended working hours and operated 7 days a week working with local community groups and Parish Councils to ensure every fridge has been filled whilst we have collected every bin. Many residents who would not normally reach out to their Council have been helped in one way or another. We were delighted to recognise the tireless work of volunteers who helped with food shopping, collecting prescriptions, and assisting at vaccination centres.

Weds 15th September	2021	Turning to the economy, over £1m per week has been channelled to businesses in direct grants during lockdown to help them survive until they can start fully trading again. This money has been a lifeline for employers including shops, pubs and other businesses who
Weds 13th October	2021	have been forced to close. I am proud of a dedicated staff that dropped everything to distribute funds quickly and without delay with the fastest and most generous schemes in Norfolk.
Weds 17th November	2021	Whilst our leisure centres have been closed, a quarter of our staff have been redeployed to

Weds 9th February	2022	In addition, 25 staff also volunteered to work on our hospital wards and supporting the NHS in other ways when the pressure was greatest. You may not have seen any of this work as you and your family members have been forced to stay at home. But be assured that your Council staff have never worked as hard or as flexibly to keep essential services going in the most difficult of circumstances to keep you safe and secure and nurture an economy that can bounce back when lockdown is finally

What is Happening In Your Area

We just wanted to send you all a message from the Safer Neighbourhood Team during these challenging times we find ourselves in. Although we are finding different ways of working and engaging, we want to let you know that your Beat Managers are still here for your communities; dealing with local priorities and concerns. We have been conducting foot, cycle and vehicle patrols getting to as many places as possible, hopefully some of you will have seen us and given us a wave. We are really keen to continue to hear from our communities about issues and concerns you have and as always we are reliant on you being vigilant and reporting incidents and information to us. This can be done through the normal routes, for instance if it's a crime in progress or threat to life always call 999; otherwise call 101, or use the online reporting forms at our website <u>www.norfolk.police.uk</u> or you can contact your local Beat Managers via email at SNTHarleston@norfolk.pnn.police.uk, SNTDiss@norfolk.pnn.police.uk or SNTLongStratton@norfolk.pnn.police.uk. When we are able, we will be holding our usual Local Public meetings and Engagement Surgeries where we will provide you with a detailed update on local priorities. In the meantime, we can advise there have been a number of positive arrests due to proactive policing to combat criminality, despite the change in demand. We have identified a number of positive arrests due committing crime and have arrested people on suspicion of drug dealing; burglary and a series of Anti Social Behaviour



COMMUNITY UPDATE COVID-19





This week has seen the most significant easing of restrictions since the third national lockdown was introduced in January and we know these last few months have been extremely challenging for everyone, regardless of your circumstances.

The move to Step 2 of the government's roadmap out of lockdown will have come as a huge relief to many, with non-essential shops, hairdressers and gyms among those allowed to open their doors once again. It's also seen the reopening of pub, bar and restaurant gardens

Naturally, people will want to enjoy these greater freedoms, taking advantage of the chance to meet with family and friends at venues outside. We want people to enjoy themselves but to do so safely and responsibly. We know from experience of policing the night time economy that things don't always turn out that way. With restrictions having been in place for so long, there is always a bit of a concern that people can overdo it, especially when there's alcohol involved. So please go out, enjoy seeing your friends and family but be sensible and stay safe.

I also think it's important we remember there will be people, particularly those from vulnerable groups, who are nervous and remain cautious about socialising. While the continued roll-out of the vaccination programme is a really positive step, the virus is still with us and a large proportion of the population is yet to be vaccinated. Even then, vaccination does not fully protect you from the virus. This is why it is still important people continue to follow social distancing guidelines.

Recognising that areas will be busier this weekend than they have been for some time, we have additional resources in place and have worked with partners, making sure venues are aware of their licensing obligations and Covid-19 guidelines.

Tomorrow is potentially a big day for Norwich City in their Premier League promotion bid. Whatever the result, please keep your celebrations within the regulations and avoid gathering in groups of more than six people. Remember - larger gatherings are still prohibited under the Health Protection Regulations.

Our journey on the roadmap out of lockdown has been overwhelmingly positive with most people embracing the gradual return of freedoms sensibly. I am sure we can expect nothing less this weekend and thank you as ever for your continued support to drive out this infection. Let's continue to protect ourselves and to protect Norfolk.

Norfolk Flooding Alliance

Meeting Report

Please se below the details of the recent Flooding Alliance Meeting and what was discussed and agreed in principle.

Leaflet and One Emergency Number

- It has been agreed that these will be signed off at the next meeting at the end of May which is good news.
- NCC has committed to producing the leaflets and having them delivered to every household in Norfolk. There will probably be two: a short one to be pinned up next to the phone or 'pinned' to the fridge with a magnet – one will be a longer 'reference' type leaflet.

Emergency Plans

• Help will be forthcoming to formulate and update plans – a lot from the Fire Brigade and us

Webinars

• More are being organised and Lord Dannatt will speak at them

Progress

• Overall, the short-, medium- and long-term plans are emerging with the core being firmed up daily. Not surprisingly there are lots of loose ends to tie up because it is a hugely complex issue developing a plan which has to last many, many years. There were 51 people invited to the meeting representing probably 30 plus relevant organisations which gives you the idea of the complexity.

Key issues still to be properly addressed

- Planning: at the moment it is the hands of seven (City, District and Borough) planning authorities plus a little by the county, all of which are a tad constrained by national guidance & legislation which will take a lot longer to change.
- Enforcement of statutory duties. The current consensus is that as much as possible should be achieved by persuasion rather than enforcement.

<u>Drought</u>

• There was some discussion as to whether the alliance should also look at ameliorating the effects of drought but because it is a key part of what WRE has to consider, it was left on the table for the moment.
