2023-24 Budget was agreed, and the clerk asked all councillors to check their precept request form for the correct figure of £24,864.20 which agreed with the budget report previously agreed. The council have kept the Band D charge this year the same as last year at £60.35 and the increase in the precept amount to be claimed had increase due to the band D housing figure increasing from 408 to 412 allowing us to not increase the band D charge but increase our precept request as below

7. To receive an update on the following current issues and to consider any necessary action.

Tree Warden report

Ken went with Tim to look at some central Hedging. Along with the fifty trees we got in December to look at free tree packs and hedging packs from Woodland Trust and these packs would be great for the Surveyors land and a question was asked on getting new hedges for Hapton Community land behind the cabin. It was agreed to apply for these in November and March at around 420 packs each time. Tim took the meeting through the makeup of the packs. The application for November close in August so Tim and Ken will work on this.

Footpath issues

Finger post BR1 still not been reinstated, and the clerk will again report this that he firstly reported in November 2021. Clerk to contact Highways urgently on this asap.

The clerk reported that the footpath FP32 had been diverted as requested under the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 Sect 257 as per the document from Birketts solicitors that the clerk will scan and ensure is on the website.

Parish Maintenance

The clerk reported that he had asked for two bins to be delivered to Hapton Meadow and as, yet these have not been, but should be after the Christmas break. These have still not arrived and The clerk will chase.

The clerk also reported that he had been made aware that the battery in the Defib in Tharston Street was no longer working and when checked he sourced a new battery, and it has been installed by the clerk and the Defib works perfectly now

The clerk also reported that the tap at Tharston Church has again been blocked and he has instructed GLS to look at this asap.

8. To receive a report on the Hapton Community Project

The clerk had received a request from Elections at SNDC on the possibility of using the cabin for the upcoming elections. He had met with the elections team, and they are keen for this to happen but are worried about no electric. The clerk made them aware that we could provide hot water in our flasks during the day for them along with Tea and Coffee. Many pictures were taken, and they were impressed but asked it there was a possibility we could install charger points for mobile phones and iPads as they are here for 16 hours as there were no actual plug points for this to happen

The chair commented that this is possible, but no costs were discussed. It was agreed that we would go ahead with this with costs to be looked at.

This would bring in revenue for the cabin and make it easier for parishioners to vote at the upcoming elections rather than go to Forncett.

It was also discussed the possibility of a key safe for the building.

The chair has recharged the battery and we need to get the solar panel asap. The battery had lasted over 4 months.

Sue and Tim trimmed back the trees on Holly Lane.

Fisher German wants to Survey the land for pylons and Tim will reply to this

Tim has created some leaf mold for next year and the seeds are down, so they get the cold snap they need but Tim has run out of seeds, and we need to purchase some more moving forward.

A question was asked on selling off the Carbon offset from these trees, but it was noted this could not be done at present. The Christmas tree farm was again discussed.

12. To discuss an update on the wildlife river corridor

The Forncett nature matters group have been to see us and they are extremely impressed with most things in the parish. They are concerned with the river Tas as there are only 25 chalk rivers in Norfolk. 210 worldwide with one in Tharston and Hapton. On Friday 20th at Forncett Village Hall they will be holding a session on what they are doing moving forward and what we can do as a group also. All are welcome to attend.

Otter filmed in our village again too which is good news.

13. To discuss the response from Border-Hoppa on the bus idea

The clerk had now spoken with Border-Hoppa, and they are keen on our plans and initiative with Thursdays being the best day to work with them. It was thought we need to put our heads together to devise a route that takes in local villages and times and stop points with Border-Hoppa asap.

It was agreed that we need to prove the viability for this service and then with information we can lobby the bus companies to provide this service.
