

Obviously the big one is the provision of the new community field in Hapton for all to use and as per the update in the introduction notes the parish council have now put the deposit on the paly equipment and the cabin and will soon be ordering the picnic benches and hopefully the compostable toilet.

The Parish Council have now installed a book exchange in the phone box by Hapton Garage (that houses the defib) and all parishioners are welcome to bring and exchange books at their leisure and even put unwanted books into the exchange. We must thank Graham Bleach for all his work on this.

The Parish Council are also keen to work with Tharston Church on providing a similar scheme when the other phone box is installed on the Parish Councils land by the church to allow Tharston residents to run their own scheme.

Other plans are to provide a Compostable toilet on the same site for the church goers to use and also their own book exchange on the site for all parishioners to place old books and maybe take some new ones. The Parish Council have checked with planning and researched the covenants and as the land is owned by the parish council it is fine to do and this information has been sent to Tharston PCC for their attention. Information relating to flooding from ordinary watercourses, surface water or ground water will be shared with Norfolk County Council as the Lead Local Flood Authority and included in their Section 19 report.

We will communicate with residents of properties known to have flooded internally to investigate options for managing flood risk.

River Yare Winter Flooding Briefing

September 2021

Forncett St Peter, Hapton, Hempnall, Lower Tasburgh, Shotesham, Trowse Newton and Wramplingham.







Introduction

This is a briefing to inform and advise you of the flooding that took place in December 2020 from the River Yare and associated tributaries. We will explain what happened, what our role is, how we work with partners and what the next steps are for your community. It will not give you all the answers you want at this stage.

What happened?

In December 2020, East Anglia received an exceptionally high amount of rainfall, the River Yare area received 50mm in 18 hours, and a total of 71mm in 96 hours.

Across Essex, Suffolk and Norfolk we issued Flood Alerts to 21 different areas and Flood Warnings to 16 locations during the flooding between 24 December and 2 January 2021.

The widespread flooding and devastating impacts on people, homes and communities was a consequence of heavy rainfall falling on an already wet catchment which was especially sensitive to intense rainfall.

The Environment Agency has a strategic overview of all sources of flooding and coastal erosion. We are also responsible for flood and coastal erosion risk management activities on main rivers and the coast. Lead Local Flood Authorities (LLFAs) are county councils and unitary authorities. They lead in managing local flood risk (ie risks of flooding from surface water, ground water and ordinary (smaller) watercourses).

At the end of December 2020 over 300 properties across Norfolk suffered the devastating consequences of flooding. Within the River Yare catchment we have records of at least 24 properties being flooded internally from main rivers, although this number may be higher if flooding was not reported. Table 1 below provides further information on the communities where we are aware of flooding having occurred from main rivers, with many other properties having suffered from flooding from surface water, ordinary watercourse and ground water across the catchment. Norfolk County Council as the LLFA are producing a Section 19 report (as stipulated by the Flood & Water Management Act) which compiles information on flooded properties across Norfolk and provides recommendations.

Our role during flooding

We cannot stop all flooding, but we work to limit the impact and we do help communities to prepare. We provide 24/7 cover to respond to flooding and pollution incidents. We issue alerts and warnings to help people reduce the impact of flooding from main rivers, reservoirs, estuaries and the sea. Our primary roles during flooding are:

- providing a warning and informing service
- · operating the flood defences and structures we own and manage
- being part of a multi-agency incident command and control group

Environment Agency (EA) staff were working in the wider area across Norfolk & Suffolk responding to incident reports and checking defences.

Flood Warnings

We provide a warning and informing service through our Flood Warning Service. We have a network of both rain gauges and river gauging stations to monitor the height and flow of rivers. If a river level is measured or forecast to reach above a typical range this means that flooding is possible, and a flood warning or alert may be issued.



At 08:14 on 24th December and at 08:10 on 29th December we issued the following flood alerts respectively for the for the upper Rivers Yare, Tiffey, Tas and Wacton, and the River Yare at Norwich from Cringleford to Trowse Newton : *be alert, stay vigilant and make early preparations*



We also issued the Flood Warning; *flooding is expected, take action to protect yourself and your property, at;*

01:56 on 24th December for The River Tas through Stoke Holy Cross 23:43 on 23rd December for The River Tiffey, from Wymondham to Barford 11:34 on 24th December for The River Yare from Barnham Broom to the A11 at Cringleford 21:12 on 24th December for The River Yare from the A11 at Cringleford to Trowse Newton

If you are in an area able to receive flood warnings from us but did not receive the Floodline warnings issued as listed above, please check that you are signed up to receive them by contacting Floodline on 0345 988 1188 or sign up at: https://www.gov.uk/sign-up-for-flood-warnings

Managing and responding to flooding

During the flooding we worked closely with professional partners to minimise flooding across the Yare River catchment area. This includes working with professional partners, including the police, fire service and the rest of our partners on the Local Resilience Forum (LRF). A meeting of the LRF took place on 28 April to review the incident and we continue to work together on the recovery side of the incident.

For the duration of this event, staff were conducting 'river runs', which are operational checks of the rivers and flood plains. They would check local pinch points and bridges to ensure no debris was holding back flows and clearing any obvious blockages that could impede flows.

Data

We are collating and processing the data received from our flood survey and are reviewing our flood warning service to ensure we provide an accurate and timely warning service for future flooding. We will let you know if changes are made to your flood warning service.

We are in the process of obtaining channel survey for the River Yare and joining tributaries in preparation for us starting to update our flood modelling over the coming years. This will improve our understanding of flood risk and will utilise the information we obtained from the December 2020 flooding.

Later this year we hope to carry out threshold surveys of the properties that were known to have flooded, to help us understand the scale of the flood risk. This, in combination with the updated flood risk modelling, will help us ascertain if there are cost beneficial ways to reduce the flood risk.
